Are we just another church?

Let's say that you drive by a field full of brown cows.



Would you later tell a friend about the field of brown cows that you drove past? Was there anything remarkable about that field full of brown cows that you drove past?

Let's say you drive by a field of cows and saw one that was purple.



Would you later tell a friend about that field of cows with the purple one? Was there something remarkable about that field of cows with the purple one?

"Remarkable" is defined as "worthy of attention."

There are at least fifteen churches in Sun City Center. People drive by those churches every day. People drive by Redeemer every day. A 2008 estimate of daily traffic on SR 674 was in excess of 12,000 vehicles. That has likely increased exponentially in the last ten years along, with the housing developments around Ruskin and Wimauma.

Redeemer sits on the busiest road in Sun City Center. What is remarkable, worthy of attention, about Redeemer? Are we "just another Church"? When those 12,000+ vehicles drive by every day on SR 674 do they see "just another Church"? When we 375 consider the roughly members of Redeemer, do they find something "remarkable" enough about Redeemer to tell their friends and neighbors? Or, do even our members consider Redeemer to be "just another Church"?

In the 2010 Census it was reported that 60.2% of the Sun City Center population identified having "no religious as affiliation". That is roughly 12.000 Only 4.8% people. identified as Mainline Protestant. second highest group, 10.7%, identified as Catholic. The highest group. 18.2%, identified as Evangelical Christian.

Can you think of anything that makes Redeemer remarkable? How would that motivate you to invite someone from that 60.2% of "Nones" to Come and See what makes us remarkable.

DECEMBER STEWARDSHIP

The Mission of Redeemer is to Proclaim Jesus Christ, Grow in Faith, and Love all People!

How do the people of Redeemer support our mission? Generally through our Ministry Teams, which are supported by the people of Redeemer through their time, talents and treasure. The Ministry Teams include, although are not limited to, the following.

The Fellowship Team's mission is to provide refreshments and hospitality after worship each Sunday. They supervise the kitchen and supplies to determine needs and potential improvements. This team supervised the upgrades and improvements to the kitchen and appliances.

The Stewardship & Finance Team's mission is to review the current financial records provided by the Bookkeeper. They can make recommendations to the Council regarding upcoming financial concerns, etc. The team is also responsible for the Stewardship and Spending Plan of the congregation. The 2019 Stewardship Campaign, Consecration Sunday, comes under their mission.

The Social Ministry Team's mission is to develop and implement ways in which our congregation reaches into the community and beyond to touch lives in need of God's Grace. These are the ways in which our people become the hands and feet of Christ in a broken world. Each month there is a designated project for which the congregation donates material items and money; and, there is a benevolence to which the congregation provides financial assistance.

Our Property Team's mission is the care and upkeep of our building and grounds. Various people from the Church volunteer their time to make improvements and maintain things in

working order. For larger projects we need to hire contractors. We also have a part time custodian who keeps the inside of the building presentable before and after the various meetings that happen during the week.

The Worship and Music Team's mission is the general oversight of everything that happens in Worship from the time Sandy begins the Prelude until Sandy plays the Postlude. Team Members consist of representatives from a variety of other ministry teams like the Altar Guild, the Worship Assistants, the Ushers, the Council, and the Organist/Choir Director.

The Women of the ELCA (WELCA) Team's mission is to encourage every woman to participate in any or all of the helpful and interesting programs or activities. They are diligent in discerning the needs of our people, and arranging for knowledgeable speakers and quality programs that educate and inform. Through various fund raising efforts they also reach out to people in need from around the community and around the world.

The Parish Nurse Team's mission is to assist and inform the people of Redeemer and Sun City Center. Our nurses are available to answer health questions that people might have regarding any medical conditions and medications and more. There are monthly education opportunities offered. The nurses offer blood pressure checks, ensure our First Aid kits have up to date items; and make sure that the A.E.D. (heart) units and Bleed Bags are kept in working order.


Our Home Visitation and Home Communion Team's mission is to extend vital care for our homebound/facility-bound people from the congregation. Our people value these monthly visits and receiving Holy Communion which helps them to feel like they are still a part of the community at Redeemer.

Our Vocal and Hand Bell Choir Team's mission is to enhance worship through God's gift of music. Martin Luther said that next to the Word of God music deserves the highest praise. The choir enhances the worship from the processional to the

recessional. On occasion some choir members add their musical instruments to the organ/keyboard to accentuate the Worship service. The Hand Bell Choir preforms periodically during the worship service.

One article does not provide enough space to cover all that the various Ministry Teams do to support Redeemer's Mission to Proclaim Jesus Christ, Grow in Faith, and Love All People. If you cannot serve our Mission with your time, then we invite you to serve through your talent for prayer and a portion of your treasure. If you cannot (yet) serve our Mission through your talents, we invite you to give of your time and a portion of your treasure. If you cannot support our Mission with a portion of your treasure, then we invite you to give of your time and talents.

As you can see from the above list of just these few Ministry Teams, your contributions to God's work at Redeemer are not merely about meeting a budget or paying bills. There is Mission Ministry happening here every day, and we encourage everyone to become part of that Mission as we strive toward God's preferred future for Redeemer.



ABDOMINAL AORTIC ANEURYSM

An abdominal aortic aneurysm is an enlarged area in the lower part of the aorta, the major blood vessel that supplies blood to the body. The aorta, about the thickness of a garden hose, runs from your heart through the center of your chest and abdomen.

Because the aorta is the body's main supplier of blood, a ruptured abdominal aortic aneurysm can cause life-threatening bleeding.

Depending on the size and the rate at which your abdominal aortic aneurysm is growing, treatment may vary from watchful waiting to emergency surgery.



Symptoms

Abdominal aortic aneurysms often grow slowly and usually without symptoms, making them difficult to detect. Some aneurysms will never rupture. Many start small and stay small, although many expand over time. Others expand quickly. Predicting how fast an abdominal aortic aneurysm may enlarge is difficult. As an abdominal aortic aneurysm enlarges, some people may notice:

- A pulsating feeling near the navel
- Deep, constant pain in your abdomen or on the side of your abdomen
- Back pain

If you have any of these signs and symptoms, such as sudden severe back or abdominal pain, get immediate emergency help.

Diagnosis

Abdominal aortic aneurysms are often found during a routine examination or during routine medical tests, such as a chest X-ray or ultrasound of the heart or abdomen. If your doctor suspects that you have an aortic aneurysm, specialized tests can confirm it. These tests might include abdominal ultrasound, CT Scan, or a MRI.

Treatment

The goal of treatment is to prevent your aneurysm from rupturing. Generally, your treatment options are close medical monitoring or surgery. Your doctor's decision depends of the size of the aneurysm and how fast it is growing.
